Course Title: Introduction to linguistic

Course Credits: 6

Language of Instruction: Albanian

Course Description: This course provides basic knowledge in all disciplines and linguistics of cross-disciplinary disciplines, which results from the connections of the science of science with other linguistic sciences. The course will build a complete network of information on the functioning of the hierarchy of language units. The study of language and linguistics as the science of language, its function, and the way it works, constitutes one of the most important theoretical discussions.

Course Goals: At the theoretical and practical level, the subject aims to present the different layers of the linguistic disciplines, having as criteria the function, combination, and use of the linguistic units.

- A. The student will be able to discuss and choose language problems in areas such as phonetics, semantics, morphology and syntax, sociolinguistics, and the history of languages.
- B. Through semantic analysis, they will look at the abilities of a language to have one or more meanings.
- C. The study of a linguistic base will reveal their functions and involvement in larger structures, thus saying the meeting point and the difference between linguistic disciplines.

Course Requirements: The continued assessments, which contribute to course grading, include: Attendance and participation during seminar sessions (10 points); Partial evaluation (15 points); Written assignments or discussions (15 points).
